#### **Focus on Enrichment**

Enrichment at the Upper Academy is based on 6 career competencies (Teamwork, Communication, Listening, Problem Solving, Creative Thinking and Emotional Wellbeing). Each half-term explores these competencies, with Teamwork being the current direction. Students have been engaged with different career based board games, encouraging the use of teamwork skills. Possessing these skills are the qualities and abilities that allow you to work well with others during conversations, projects, meetings or other collaborations and, are a result of your ability to be a good communicator, to actively listen and be responsible and honest; all of which help our students to develop.

Teamwork skills are important for students to learn as they will be required to work alongside others in every industry at every level in their career. Doing so in an empathetic, efficient and responsible manner can help them accomplish career goals, enhance their CV and contribute positively to their organisation. It can also help them build rapport with others, leading to deeper working relationships, new connections and possibly new opportunities.

#### **Absence Procedures**

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)
