Year 11 Visit the Golden Hinde

Year 11 History students recently had the opportunity to visit the Golden Hinde, a full-size reconstruction of the famous Elizabethan galleon.

The purpose of this immersive experience was to provide our historians with a first-hand understanding of the motivations behind Sir Francis Drake's historic circumnavigation and its impact on the early modern world.

Led by a knowledgeable tour guide, students were given a tour of the ship, giving them an understanding of the challenges and dangers, that 16th-century mariners faced.



To illustrate the path the ship took during it's circumnavigation, the tour guide stood on a giant map of the world talking through key point and facts. In addition to enriching their contextual knowledge, there were opportunities for our students to actively participate in the maritime tasks of the 16th century. Several members of the group volunteered to raise the anchor and even simulate the preparations to fire a cannon.

Students will be answering question about Drake's circumnavigation of the globe for the 'historic environment question' in their GCSE exams and this visit undoubtedly served as a stepping stone towards their success in their upcoming exams.




Young Minds offer information to young people and children about mental health and emotional wellbeing. If you need to talk, they can let you know about organisations that listen, plus they offer online support and info.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)


