Leadership Message - Year 11 Final Exam Support and Preparation

Over the next two weeks, we are running a series of specialist and targeted sessions for all Year 11 students, to support them before the summer exams series begins.

This week the students' normal timetables will be suspended whilst they complete revision lessons in English, Maths and Science, including some innovative sessions on 'Maths in Science'. These revision sessions are specifically targeted for each group to ensure that students are focusing on the correct key topics and grade levels to help them secure their target grade. Alongside core lessons, students will still be completing their options subjects, PE and French. Some students will also be participating in drop down days in Engineering and ICT in order to support them with meeting the component deadlines in these Vocational subjects.

Week beginning 29th April, all Year 11 students will be sitting their French Speaking exam. The students will be given a time slot where they will attend the exam preparation room where they will be under exam conditions; they will have an allocated room to prepare for their exam, before entering the exam room. The process will take approximately 30 minutes per student, and counts for 25% of the final exam grade.

We are extremely confident that these bespoke revision lessons will support the students with exam confidence and skills as well as revisiting key topics that will make a positive difference to their final grades.



Vocational and home language exams start on Tuesday 7th May. The first exam for the whole year group is on Friday 10th May; Biology Paper 1.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank parents and carers for their support during this time and wish all students the best of luck in the forthcoming weeks.

Parent Drop In - Wednesday 24th April


This week's Parent Drop In will be on Wednesday 24th April, between 8:30am - 9:30am.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.

- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)

What does a Textile Designer do?

Your day-to-day duties may include:

producing initial sketches by hand, or on a computer using design software reworking designs until they meet the customer's needs making up samples or having them made by technicians researching design trends to decide what will sell working with clients, technical staff, marketing and buying staff keeping up-to-date with developments in manufacturing technology If you're self-employed, you'll also need to manage your own business activities like marketing, finances and your website.
