



## Exam information — At the start

#### Warning to candidates

1 x Level 2 course (Equivalent to a GCSE)

Pass your GCSE resit in the first year – you have access to A-Levels (Year 13 and 14)
Pass Functional skills courses in 2 years you will look to go into employment
