British Science Week 2023

To celebrate British Science Week, Upper Academy students participated in experiments and workshops based on the theme 'Connections'.

Students learned about programming and successfully created an algorithm to instruct a pretend robot to make a jam sandwich. Towards the end of the week, students welcomed Dr Ken Farquhar and his Spectacular Entertaining Science Show. Dr Ken demonstrated why jugglers love gravity, how a drill can keep a basketball spinning and, why unicyclists keep moving to stay still. Students discovered how these and other circus skills relate to the world around us.

Attendance Expectations

There is a clear link between academic success and attendance and as such our expectations for attendance are that:

- Parents have a legal duty to ensure their child attends regularly.
- Students should have 100% attendance each year.
 Students with attendance below 95% are of concern.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers should contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)
