Leadership Message

Our Year 11 students have now completed the first phase of their Autumn exams, with the last written papers being completed today. They have displayed a great attitude to learning and shown tremendous resilience, so thank you for your support during this time.

Over the next two weeks, students will be taking practical exams in Art, Photography, 3D Design and Engineering, giving them the opportunity to rehearse for their exams next Summer. As with the written exams, this will also provide us with essential information on how we can best support students to achieve their full potential in the final exams.

The practical exams will run alongside our normal teaching timetable, so students not taking an exam will be attending their normal lessons.

The results of these exams will be shared with students on Thursday 15th January, and their full report will be available on the **My Child at School** (MCAS) app by Friday 16th January. Alongside the summary page detailing the GCSE grade, the full report will identify both areas of strength and any gaps in understanding. This will allow teachers and students to focus on those areas that will have the greatest impact on outcomes, so they have the best chance of securing their chosen post-16 destination.

- Parent/carers may be asked for medical evidence to support absences after 3 days or reoccurring absence patterns.
