

Thank you to everyone who contributed to this meaningful project, helping to make it a success for the second consecutive year!


Uniform Price Increase

Tuesday:	Epistemology (Noun) Definition: The theory of knowledge, especially with regard to its methods, validity, and scope. Example: Epistemology plays a crucial role in understanding the foundational principles of learning and knowledge acquisition.	
Wednesday:	Metacognition (Noun) Definition: Awareness and understanding of one's own thought processes. Example: Developing metacognition can greatly enhance students' ability to learn effectively by reflecting on their own learning strategies.	
Thursday:	Pedagogy (Noun) Definition: The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. Example: Innovative pedagogy methods can transform the learning experience, making it more engaging and effective.	
Friday:	Didactic (Adjective) Definition: Intended to teach, particularly in having moral instruction as an ulterior motive. Example: The didactic nature of the lecture aimed to not only impart knowledge but also instill ethical values in the students.	

Job of the Week: Zoo Veterinarian

What does a Zoo Veterinarian do?

They mostly work in zoos, museums, aquariums or research facilities to care for and treat the illnesses and injuries of captive animals.

- sedating, diagnosing and treating sick and injured animals
- performing operations
- carrying out tests such as blood analysis, X-rays and scans
- carrying out regular health checks and giving vaccinations
- keeping records of treatments

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

Study at least two science subjects, ideally including biology, at Level 3 (for example, Scottish Highers or A levels), and achieve very high grades as places can be limited pass entry exams (in Europe, these are usually in chemistry and biology) or an interview complete work experience in a veterinary practice study an approved veterinary degree be registered with an accredited veterinary organisation in your country, like the RCVS (UK) or EAEVE (Europe)
